



Mini Round Robin Group

It looks like we're going to have some beautiful Mini Round Robin quilts as 15 members are participating. The October meetings will be your last chance to register for this group.

Here's how a Round Robin works. Each of you makes a 12 1/2 inch block. It will finish as 12 inches. You make any pattern and colour you like. When your block is handed in to me add a fat quarter so those who work on your block can use in the borders or just get colour ideas from it. I'll assign 4 members to work on the borders. The first person will add a 2 1/2 inch border, the second will add a 1 1/2 inch border, the 3rd will add a 4 1/2 border and the 4th and final border will be 3 1/2 inches. Borders can be anything the assigned person wishes except just stripes of fabric. It can be pieced, paper pieced or appliqued. The quilts will be mailed to the next person to work on. We'll have until the June

meeting to get the 4 borders added and back in the hands of the owner.

Please remember to bring your 12 1/2 inch block and fat quarter for me to the October meeting. I'll be mailing the blocks to the first person to work on by the end of October. Any questions my phone number is 519-998-1033.

The "I'M POSSIBLE" Project for Victims Services



Many of you may remember last guild season when we had a presentation by staff representative, Ashley Hendricks, about Victim's Services in our Community and then Robin Bogaert from our own guild cited some examples from her work with the City of Windsor. Eileen Fennel also spoke about this at the evening guild meeting.

The City of Waterloo has generously provided us with a Community Project Grant specifically for the purpose of making quilts for Victims in our community in partnership with Victim's Services. At the end of the presentation an "Expression of Interest" page was sent around and **over 40** guild members signed up to support this project by agreeing to volunteer in some capacity. We are so thankful for this!

A committee of 5 guild members has formed to head up this initiative and these members are: Marg Sandiford, Lilla Hall, Darlene Yanke, Eileen Fennel and Robin Bogaert. They will purchase fabric, batting and backings, assemble kits and coordinate a project workshop. Thank you to all of these ladies for stepping forward to launch this initiative!

The Victims Services Project has been named! Based on a quote by Audrey Hepburn "Nothing is Impossible", the statement itself says "I'M POSSIBLE".


We are calling this the "I'M POSSIBLE Project" in order to convey a positive and motivating message to the victims/recipients of our quilts. Thanks to Darlene Yanke for suggesting this.

A decision about the type(s) of quilts was also made. As most of the recipients of our quilts will be adult and female we have decided to use very identifiable, traditional quilt blocks that convey a comforting and perhaps nostalgic message. We are hoping to present some of these quilts by the end of 2017. The quilt blocks are **friendship stars, nine-patches and log cabins**. The log cabin will stand-alone as a **Log Cabin Quilt**, with lots of layout potential. The friendship star and nine-patch blocks will be combined creating the **Friendship Stars & Chains** quilts. Samples of these blocks and construction will be shown at the October guild meeting.



quilt size= 60 x 84






How can you get involved in this fantastic project to help those who have been victimized in our community?

- Pick up a block kit at the next guild meeting Oct. 18, 2017 and/or Nov. 15
- Complete your block from your kit at home or.....
- Pick up instructions only at the guild and make blocks from your own fabric at home (please follow colour guidelines in the pattern so our quilts are consistent).
- Make additional blocks (as many as you like) using our pattern guidelines
- Attend our "I'M POSSIBLE Project" workshop (date and time to be announced at the next guild meeting). The workshop is to be held at the Waterloo Regional Police Detachment Community Room, Corner of Columbia and Weber Streets in Waterloo. Please bring your own machine and tools. Irons will be provided.
- We will make blocks and assemble quilts at this workshop. Instruction will be provided.
- Lunch and treats will be provided at the workshop at no cost to you.
- You will enjoy easy quilt block construction, great conversation and a sense of pride in your work and in helping your community!

*** Also Important ***

If you cannot make it to the workshop but want to participate in some way: We need quilting volunteers, binding assistance, donations of fabric, batting etc.

Fabric donations should be white to cream backgrounds and medium to dark strips, 2½" strips (nine patch), 2⅞" strips (friendship stars) and 2½" strips (log cabin) .We welcome and appreciate any help!




