




Size is 56" X 72".




My Mystery Quilt



The quilt is machine appliquéd by blanket stitch with turned and finished edges, my favourite quilting technique and one I have been doing and teaching for about 15 years. A bit of trapunto, metallic thread and embroidery and tons of free motion and straight line quilting with silk thread complete the quilt. All of Santa's workshops carry the names of my grandchildren. Sienna wasn't born when the quilt was made so her name was added later to one of the stars at the top of the quilt. It did win a red ribbon and Award of Excellence in the 2014 Manitoba Prairie Quilters show. I loved playing with all of the different fabrics and thoroughly enjoyed the whole process. A wonderful pattern.




