
Tumbler Quilts

Tumbler Template Drafting




Detail of Vikki's Tumbler Quilt

On paper draw a 5" square. On the bottom line of the square go in 1 inch on both edges. Draw extension lines from the upper corners to the 1-inch mark and extend them. Choose any size tumbler you wish. If you cut your template $\frac{1}{2}$ an inch higher than the final desired size, you will have a template that includes the $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch seam allowances.



Quilt Construction Tips


1. When joining tumblers in a row, press all the seams in the same direction. For the next row press all the seams in the opposite direction. Then the seams nest easily.
2. At the corners of two tumblers being sewn together there is a small overlap which should meet at the $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch mark.
3. Cutting out the tumblers is a no-waste situation. From a strip cut the height of your template, cut tumblers, alternating the direction of the tumbler.



Hexagonal Quilts

Hexagonal Template Drafting


- Draw lines on a hexagon as long as you wish.
- Mark equal points of lengths on each line.
- You can create a template for any size hexagon you wish.
- Don't forget to add a $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch seam allowance on all cut sides if you split the shape as in Tamara Gilhuly's quilt below right.



Bonus

To change the size of any block on a photocopier: Divide the size you want by the size you have and multiply by 100%.

$$\frac{\text{size you want}}{\text{size you have}} \times 100\%$$

WCQG QUILT EXHIBIT 2017

We are looking for all kinds of quilts to be shown at our Quilt Exhibit on October 13-14, 2017. Just about any quilt project will fit into one of these categories:

- Small wall quilt - maximum perimeter 180 inches (no minimum)
- Large wall quilt—perimeter greater than 180 inches
- Modern quilt
- Bed or lap quilt
- Other items - i.e., quilted jacket, quilted carrying bag
- Group quilt
- Small draw quilt - these quilts are used as draw prizes and will not be returned to you
- President's Challenge quilt

You may submit a maximum of six entries into the quilt exhibit in addition to the President's Challenge. Please look at the WCQG website under "Quilt Exhibit" to see the revised instructions when making a quilt sleeve.

Entry forms for all quilts need to be completed by the end of June. Quilts will be photographed at The Creative Sisters Quilt Studio in August 2017. Exact photography dates are yet to be determined. If you are planning a holiday in August, please make arrangements with a friend or family member to take your quilt(s) in to be photographed.

PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE

For this year's President's Challenge, Eileen has chosen the theme of a song title or a line from a song. The size of the finished quilt should be 12½" by 12½" (the size of a record album!)

You may interpret the song title or line as you wish. Be creative. Will we be able to identify your song?

Your entry must have a sleeve and a label with your name, the name of the quilt, and the category (2017 President's Challenge) The challenge quilts must be finished and shown at the June 2017 guild meeting.

We will also be looking for a variety of sewn or quilted items to sell at our Boutique during the exhibit.

CANADA'S BIG QUILT BEE - SLAB DAYS MARCH 24 & 25



Come for a sewing day to benefit Ronald McDonald houses. CQA/ACC has challenged guilds across Canada to celebrate our country's 150th birthday by making 1000 slab quilts to benefit children and their families.

Friday, March 24th and Saturday, March 25th will be WCQG's effort to

fulfill this goal. It will be held at the Waterloo Church of Christ building, 470 Glenelm Crescent (right next door to the Albert McCormick Arena and Community Centre where we meet for our monthly guild meetings.) It will run from 9am to 4pm each day. We are limited to 30 quilters per day, so please sign up for your preferred day at the March guild meetings. There will be no charge for this event; please bring your lunch - coffee, tea and water will be provided.

Construction details for these blocks/quilts are available on the CQA/ACC website <https://www.canadianquilter.com/pdf/quilt-canada-2017/Quilting-Bee-How-to-make-a-block.pdf> and in our September 2016 newsletter. "Canada" fabric is to be included in each quilt, if not each block and it has been generously provided by Bonnie Murdoch (Thanks, Bonnie!) You can make slabs or whole quilts to donate. Finished quilts will be delivered by Kathy Bissett, Judy Siegner and Marg Sandiford to a Toronto Ronald McDonald house in the spring. **Slabs that are finished before March 8 will be taken to an address near Ottawa by Kathy Bissett (please contact her if you have some available.)** Slabs completed in our workshop will be assembled into quilts.

This event is also open to non-guild members, but we'll need their names to reserve their spots.

You may contribute 12 1/2" slab blocks to Quilt Canada before the end of May to be quilted at Quilt Canada by volunteers in June. There will be a limited number of long arm machines and quilters available, so if we can assemble, quilt and bind these quilts and deliver them completed, it will be most appreciated. Labels will be available at our Slab Days and online at the CQA/ACC website mentioned above.

CANADA'S BIG QUILT BEE - SLAB DAYS MARCH 24 & 25

What to bring to our Slab Days: (please identify all your stuff with address labels or masking tape)

- ◇ Sewing machine
- ◇ Extension cord
- ◇ Basic sewing supplies
- ◇ Rotary cutter, mat and ruler
- ◇ Iron (we'll borrow the Mannheim irons & pads)
- ◇ Lunch
- ◇ Scrap fabric - strips, orphan blocks, small bits, novelty prints (keep in mind these quilts are for children.) You might even press these ahead of time so you can start right in sewing. Judy Siegner will be bringing some of Caring Connections' "inventory"
- ◇ Larger pieces for backing (the guild will provide the batting)
- ◇ Portable design wall (or Dollar store picnic table cloth - plastic with a flannel back)
- ◇ Guild name tag

You are welcome to press, cut and sew on your own or work as a team in an assembly line, switching jobs as the day progresses. Quilt tops may have borders, but they are not required. There will be labels available.

Come for a day of sewing with friends working together for a worthy cause.

Eileen and Kathy's Continuing Adventure: Alias Grace – It's a wrap!

If you remember, my first day on the set was the last scene of the movie. They then do what they call "inserts". Grace would do some close-up quilting and letter writing in a journal – calling on my aged hands.

My day begins when I arrive at the studio and I'm shown my trailer section. The sign says "Grace's hand double". Eileen and I wait until someone from wardrobe brings me my costume. Then it's off to makeup. My hands are made to look as if I've been doing laundry in lye soap for 40 years – red knuckles and fingernails.

The first "acting" I have is to stand beside the paradise quilt and gently caress a snake on the quilt. The director (very cute) is saying "faster", "slower", "left hand higher" and says it doesn't look natural. I said the camera track was digging in my ribs. Things went a little better after that. I didn't want to tell them the actress in the first scene was not caressing the quilt, she was beating it. I then had to quilt, which meant quilting on top of quilting, going left, right and down. I ripped the stitches off one of the snake heads and appliqued it back on.

My calligraphy teacher had taught me how to do English round hand copperplate writing, fast and fairly illegible, which I find out later they would want slower and more legible. On the last day of shooting (day 65), they have me come to Toronto to write 2 lines in the prison log book. It took all day but they let us watch other scenes being filmed while we waited. We did different takes on the writing, all with a big camera over my shoulder and right beside my head. I had to write with my hand way to the side so the camera could see what I was writing while trying to keep it legible.


